**Family craft drop-ins** ran throughout the year on Saturdays: Valentine's, Mother's/Father's Day, and Halloween themed crafts. We also ran Spring and Christmas break drop-in days for the kids to do various activities, crafts, and movie days.









The Puzzle exchange program continues to run throughout the year letting patrons come in and exchange the puzzle of their choice. What a great way to provide a service to the community without a cost involved.



**Toy Lending Library:** We have over 70 games, toys, sports equipment and interactive books which lend out for a 2 week period. This provides an opportunity for parents to let their children try out a new item without the expense of purchasing it only to find their child lose interest in a short time. A selection of toys is available for borrowing and we have a catalogue showing the whole collection.



**Snowshoe Lending Program:** Springfield Public Library has snowshoes to lend out to the public. These snowshoes come in varying sizes - kids / youth (generally for ages 6 and up) and adult. Anyone from the public is invited to check them out to try snowshoeing in the greater outdoors this winter.



**Walking Poles & Pedometers:** We provide the opportunity for patrons of all ages, to borrow walking poles and/or pedometers for at least a month. These are available for the patrons throughout the year.



**Better Than Therapy Book Club:** A wonderful community group of book lovers who gather the first Friday of each month to discuss the book chosen for that month. Patrons are always welcome to join in on their meetings or to just pick up one of the books to see what people are reading!



Storytime is a favourite for preschoolers aged 2 - 5 years. In three 8-week sessions (once a week on Wednesdays) Miss. Cherie engages the childrens imagination, through storytelling and craft activities. We also hold special party dates and pyjama days too.



Baby Rock 'n' Read runs once a week, concurrently with Mind & Body, in 3 eight week sessions from September until June. This program introduces literacy while babies bond with their caregivers in the company of friends. Bright colours, rhyming verses, music and songs, while sitting in a circle, help infants develop name and sound recognition through repetition.



Mind & Body introduces 4 & 5-year-olds to games, activities, fine motor skills and movements which introduce and develop literacy and numeracy through play.



Springfield Archives is located right inside our facility. The archives holds all the records since Springfield Municipality was founded. From land title information to local history, the archives has it all. The Archives is run by dedicated volunteers.

The 9th Annual Book Sale & Amnesty days took place from Friday, May 25th until June 2nd. We received a huge amount of donated books through the year. We started to weed our collection to add to the sale. The library successfully raised funds and hopes to continue this book sale every year.



The TD Summer Reading Program ran at SPL this year. We also ran a summer camp program. We combined the two together and the children were immersed in 'Feed your Passion'. They read, did crafts and played games. With every 20 minutes read each child received 1 ballot, for a chance to win a prize at the end of summer. Every book report handed in also received a free library movie rental. The goal of the program was to encourage reading. It was very successful!



Our 6th Annual Art Music Wine Night was held on Sept 28th. It was an evening with our local signature artists: Ida MacKenzie, Susan Selby, Genevie Henderson, Mariel Gobeil, Dori Laine & John Pawlyk presenting their great talent for all to see and purchase. With the purchase of admission for the evening, patrons received a glass of wine, an evening of live local talent and hors d'oeuvres. All artwork was for purchase and 25% of all sales were donated to the library.



We held our 9th Annual Christmas Craft Sale. This has been our major fundraiser, with former board member Sally Colomy coordinating each sale from 2009 to her passing in 2015. We have up kept what she started. The library gets filled with many crafters in all nooks and crannies of the library, and we have a silent auction & canteen available for all to enjoy.



On December 14th Ron Schuler, on behalf of the Province of Manitoba, presented the library with a PLS funding grant of more than \$135,000. This grant is critical to our success in providing much needed services and programs to the citizens in the RM of Springfield.



All the events that are organized at the library wouldn't be available without the partnerships, volunteers, board and staff members that make them possible. To those of you who dedicate yourselves to the library and its events we give our sincerest appreciation.
