Events & Programs

TD Summer Reading: July - August

This year's TD Summer Reading Program was run by Samantha Carter. Similar to last year, the library remained closed to the public, so we provided parents with take-home kits!

Each week we provided all 86 participants (compared to last year's 38) with a kit that included: colouring pages, craft supplies, activity sheets and snack recipe ideas. All pages in these kits were also provided on our website, allowing parents to print any of the pages at home.

To encourage children to read during the quarantine, we provided them with reading log sheets. For every 20 minutes read, the child would receive a ballot towards a chance to win a grand prize. Any child that completed the provided activity sheets and returned them to the library, would receive a bonus ballot. If the participant handed in a book report, they were given a free movie rental.

Rock Hunt July - Aug

The staff painted and hid rocks around the RM of Springfield. Patrons were encouraged to find rocks and bring them back to the library to claim a prize. They could keep the rock or return it so we could rehide it. We received tons of compliments saying that this got children out and active during the summer.

Pumpkin Contest Oct 1 - 27

This year, we held a pumpkin contest for our patrons. We supplied pumpkins to those who registered and placed a \$5 deposit for a spot. There were 10 contestants that handed in their pumpkins. We ended taking pictures of these pumpkins and let the patrons take them home. We then let the patrons vote for their favourite pumpkins.

Bookmark Contest Nov 2 - 27

We had three age categories for this contest, 0-6, 7 - 12, and 13+. The winners for each category had their bookmark printed and distributed to all our patrons.

2021 Reading Challenge Year Round

We had a lot of people show interest this year, with 7 Kids/Teens & 5 Adults handing in their filled-in sheets at the end of the year.

Take Home Literacy Craft Kits: Year Round

Throughout the year, we continued to provide patrons with take-home craft kits. Each month, we would post a list of crafts that would be provided for that month. Parents would contact us to register their children for the crafts they wanted.

Crafts were provided every Wednesday for the target audience of young children. Saturday crafts were geared towards, but not limited to, teens & adults.


